



Airport Facts & Statistics

Each year, Indianapolis International Airport (IND) serves about 7.5 million passengers and transports more than 1 million tons of cargo. It is an important contributor to central Indiana's growing economy, and is the nation's eighth largest cargo facility.



Daily departures and destinations

On average, there are 150 daily departures to 35 nonstop destinations from Indianapolis. Although a handful of these flights are seasonal—and all are dependent upon the airlines who can and do change their flights depending on internal operations—daily nonstop service is generally available to:
